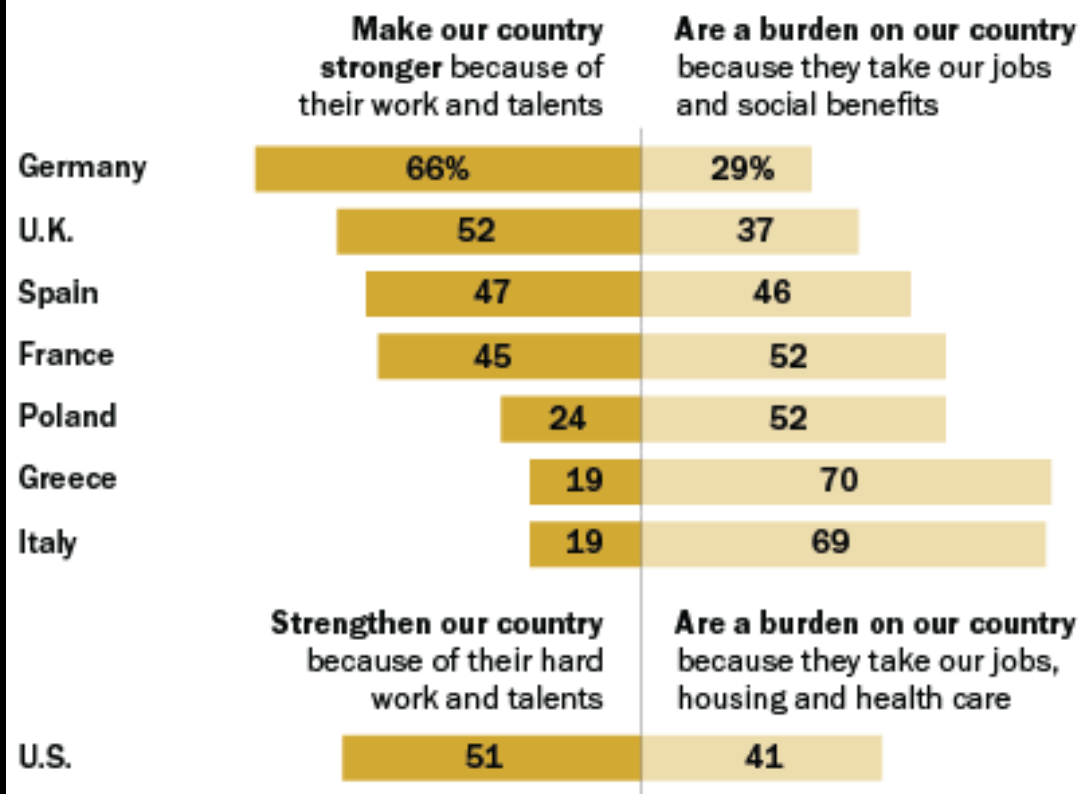

% who say immigrants today ...



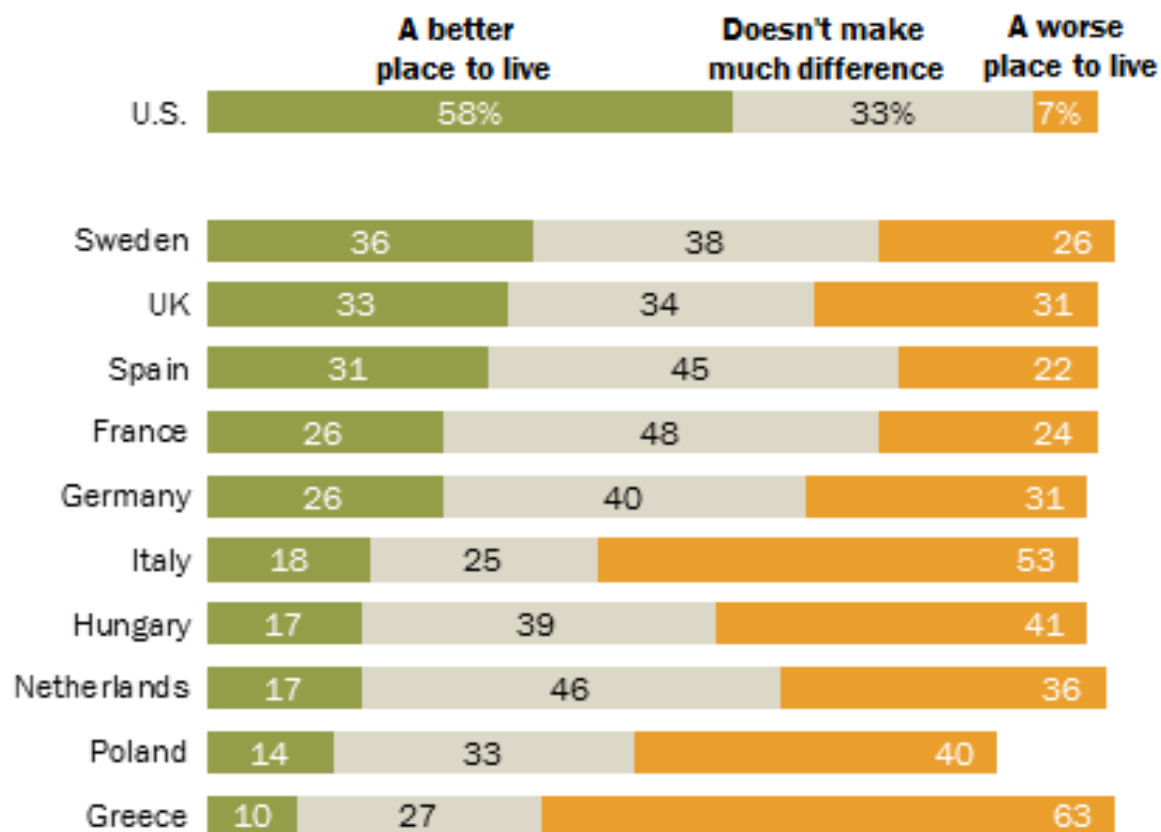
